### RELEASE & WAIVER –

The Cochise County Fair Association is requiring a Release & Waiver Form for each exhibitor who plans to show an animal entry at the 2018 Cochise County Fair. The form can be found on their website <https://cochisecountyfair.org> in the exhibitor section.

The form must be complete and submitted by mail, email, or fax by the animal entry deadline. Send completed forms to Cochise County Extension Office, 450 S Haskell Ave Ste A, Willcox, AZ 85643, email [triciadunham@email.arizona.edu](mailto:triciadunham@email.arizona.edu) or fax (520) 384-3681. **Enrollment Deadlines to Exhibit:** Exhibitor must be enrolled in the project area entered for county fair. Members must be enrolled by February 1<sup>st</sup> for Market and Carcass livestock projects, and April 1<sup>st</sup> for all other animals, and July 31<sup>st</sup> for all other areas.

**Entry Deadline:** All county fair 4-H/FFA exhibits must be entered online no later than 11:00pm, on August 1st for Horse exhibits, and September 1<sup>st</sup> for Large Stock, Small Stock, Dog and Building, to avoid late fees.

**Late Entry Fee:** There will be a late fee of \$150.00, per exhibitor, assessed for all entries received from September 2<sup>nd</sup> through September 8<sup>th</sup> for Large Stock, Small Stock, Building and Dog entries. There will be no entries received after these deadlines. NO EXCEPTIONS.

**Entry Fees:** Online payments will be accepted; payment must be made at the time entries are submitted.

The following fees apply to 4-H and FFA fair entries:

- Dog - \$3
- Horse - \$3
- Horse (Calf & Goat Classes) - \$9
- Horse – Ranch Sorting - \$30 per participant
- Market & Carcass Livestock - \$15
- Livestock - \$5
- Small Stock - \$2

Fees are payable to Cochise County 4-H, 450 S Haskell Ave, Ste A, Willcox, AZ 85643

Fees are not refundable.

**Additional Late Entry Fees:** After September 8<sup>th</sup> an additional \$25 late fee will be added to Large Stock, Small Stock and Dog Entries. If Horse entry fees are not paid by Aug. 3<sup>rd</sup>, and Large Stock, Small Stock and Dog by September 12<sup>th</sup>, the entry will be deleted.

**Fair Passes:** Fair Passes (per person, 5 & under free) and Fair Parking Passes (per vehicle) can be purchased with entries. The cost of a pass is \$6.00. If not purchased by September 1<sup>st</sup>, they must be purchased at the gate (prices vary).

Articles to be exhibited must be made, raised or collected during the current club year. Exhibits entered in the 4-H & FFA Departments may not be entered in any other fair department. Leaders/advisors will be asked to certify completion of projects.

**CHAMPION BUILDING EXHIBITOR AWARD:** Those wishing to compete for the Champion Building Exhibitor Award must designate six exhibits from at least two different divisions at the time of entry by September 1<sup>st</sup>. (If submitting a photography entry, a print must be provided). Champion Building Exhibitor Snapshot forms must be turned in with exhibits. Interview judging will take place on Saturday September 22<sup>nd</sup>. See the Champion Building Exhibitor rules in the rule book on page 8.

**ENTRY TAGS:** The Extension Office will print all entry tags. They will be provided at the time entries are received in the 4-H building and must be securely fastened to each exhibit. Photography judging will occur prior to the Fair. Entry tags for photography need to be attached on bottom right to show exhibitors name, club, etc. when displayed.

### GENERAL RULES

See Rule Book, page 7 & 8, for complete information. No exhibits will be released before 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 30.

The Danish Grouping System will be used in judging 4-H Club exhibits. A blue ribbon must be earned in order to be eligible for Best in Class and Champion division awards. Best in Class and Second in Class ribbons may be awarded to an outstanding exhibit in each class and Champion and Reserve Champion may be awarded to an outstanding exhibit in each division AT THE JUDGE'S DISCRETION. No premium monies will be awarded.

## PHOTOGRAPHY DIVISION 118

**New for 2018, Digital photo submissions are required for photography judging. In FairEntry, you will upload a JPEG image for each entry. Prints are optional for display at fair. There will be a digital slide show of all photo entries.**

An exhibit, either photo(s) or an educational display that shows learning about photography, from choosing a camera to modifying your photo.

**Color** – Photos in this category can only be cropped. They cannot have any tint, saturation, color, red eye reduction, or brightness enhancement from the computer. These photos are to be unaltered by the photographer. If you are enhancing photos, use the Enhanced Photography division to enter your photos.

**Black/White** – Any original photo taken with a black and white filter or whose only enhancement is black and white.

**Enhanced** – Any original photo enhanced through the use of digital cropping, dodging, burning, contrast, brightness, saturation, and/or red eye reduction, designed to alter the natural aspects of the original photo in Photoshop or any other photo editing technology.

**My 4-H:** A special photography exhibition – A single photograph that tells the story of 4-H and shows the 4-H'ers perspective of the 4-H experience. Photos should help the public gain a better understanding about today's dynamic and expanded 4-H opportunities.

### GENERAL RULES

See county rule book for complete rules. Each 4-H/FFA livestock exhibit must be shown by the person entering that exhibit in the fair. The Danish Grouping System will be used in judging 4-H/FFA Club exhibits. No premium monies will be awarded.

### HERDSMANSHIP

A herdsmanship award of \$25 will be awarded to an exhibitor who has been available in the barn and assisted with tasks as listed on the sign-up sheet posted in the barn.

### SHOWMANSHIP

All showmanship entries are due in September with other fair entries. Members participating in the showmanship classes must exhibit their own animal, and that animal must have been shown in a breed or pet class. Borrowing an animal from any other person will not be permitted. Champion showmanship winners from each species are eligible to participate in the Round Robin Showmanship.

Exhibitors who may be eligible to compete in more than one species must select the species they wish to compete with in the Round Robin Class. Immediately after each show, the Champion Showman (junior and senior) must notify the superintendent of the species and whether or not he/she will participate in the Round Robin. If the Champion does not want to participate, the superintendent will notify the Reserve Showman of his/her eligibility and sign the 4-H/FFA member up for the class. Only champion or the reserve (if champion declines) showmanship winners are eligible.

### RELEASE OF ANIMALS

No exhibits will be released before 5:00 p.m. on Sunday. Exhibitors must check out with a member of the check-out team before leaving.

## GENERAL RULES

Each 4-H/FFA livestock exhibit must be shown by the person entering that exhibit in the fair. The Danish Grouping System will be used in judging 4-H/FFA Club exhibits.

## SEASONAL PASS

Seasonal inspection certificates must be issued for all exhibition livestock. The form may be obtained from the 4H office or online <https://agriculture.az.gov/animals/animal-services-inspections/livestock-inspections/self-inspections>. Be sure to allow enough time to mail in the application and have it returned prior to the fair.

**SWINE HEALTH RULES** (see rule book page 22 for complete information) In order for a hog to be exhibited it must be ear notched, have a premise ID number & a Seasonal Pass prior to transporting.

## BEDDING

All exhibitors must provide their own bedding.

**BEST COCHISE COUNTY BRED & FED** For animals that qualify click yes on the Cochise County Bred & Fed question after the class selection in the entry system. (See rule book page 21 for complete information) A special championship class for the "Best Cochise County Bred & Fed Steer, Lamb, Hog and Goat", will be held. The intent of the award is to recognize quality herdsmanship within our county and to encourage the selection of superior quality animals available within Cochise County.

## MARKET LIVESTOCK SALE

Any 4-H and FFA member who has satisfactorily completed his livestock project to date and whose animal places in the blue or red ribbon color group is eligible to sell ONE animal at the Cochise County Junior Livestock Auction. All champions, grand, reserve and bred & fed champions must sell. In addition, to be eligible to sell a market animal in the auction, the exhibitor must not have sold a market animal in any other county or community fair within the last year.

## SALE ORDER

The animals will be rotated in the following order for 2018: Steer, Lamb, Hog, Goat – Champion Live, Champion Carcass, Reserve Live, Reserve Carcass, Best Bred & Fed of each; the auction would then proceed with the blue ribbon animals continuing with the rotation until all animals are sold. Species will be interspersed so that all 1st place blues, etc. will sell together and the same with the reds. Actual placing's will be listed on the sale order.

## POLICY FOR SELLING ANIMALS AT THE FAIR

“For Sale” signs will not be permitted to be placed on the animals’ stalls nor should any open business transactions for breeding or market livestock take place prior to the 4-H/FFA Market Livestock Auction on Sunday afternoon, with the exception of dairy goats and dairy cattle. **Any 4-H/FFA member found to be in violation of these rules will not be permitted to exhibit or sell livestock in the 4-H/FFA Division of next year’s fair.**

## SALE NOTIFICATION

4-H & FFA members must notify the superintendent for each market animal exhibited that they **do not** wish to sell. These must be turned into the respective superintendent as soon as possible, but no later than 9:00 a.m. on Saturday. If an exhibitor has not notified the appropriate superintendent, the superintendent has the authority to decide which animal will be sold.

## COMMISSION CHARGE

A five percent commission will be deducted from the total price the 4-H or FFA member receives from both the animal and add-ons, and retained by the Cochise County Junior Livestock Auction. The commission is used for promoting and conducting the livestock sale.

## LARGE LIVESTOCK ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP

To be held Saturday at 1:30 p.m. The Champion Junior and Senior of the following showmanship classes will participate in the round robin showmanship: Beef, sheep, swine, meat goat, dairy goat and pygmy goat showmanship. In the event the champion is unable to participate, the reserve member may participate. If neither the champion nor reserve is able to participate, there will not be a member showing, but the division will still be conducted.

## JUNIOR HERDSMANSHIP AWARDS

Awards will be based on the livestock exhibits of the club or chapter and judged on grooming and neatness of animals and equipment, neatness of pens, stalls and areas surrounding exhibits, and the presence of the exhibitors to answer questions and extend courtesies to the public.

Herdsmanship will be judged commencing on the opening day of the fair until the release of livestock. A \$25 cash award will be awarded to the club/chapter in the following livestock areas: Beef, Sheep, Swine, and Dairy/Pygmy Goats and Meat Goats.
