New for 2019 Cochise County Fair:

- We are unable to accept online entries for Open Livestock this year. All entry forms and release forms must be mailed to the Superintendent. See instructions below.
- Exhibitors under age 5 must be accompanied into the show ring by a parent or guardian.

Entries close at midnight, September 1. Entry forms must be on file before closing date. **No exceptions.** **Entry forms are required** and may be obtained from the Department Superintendent or the Fairgrounds General Office, or downloaded from the fair website, <http://cochisecountyfair.org/fair/exhibitors/>.

A release form is required for all live animals. The release form is on the last page of this file.

A Seasonal Pass is required for exhibition of all cattle, sheep, goats, and swine owned by Arizona residents and exhibited in Arizona according to state law and rule (ARS § 3-1346, R3-2-703). To receive a Seasonal Pass, the exhibitor must complete an application. Instructions and an application can be downloaded online at <https://agriculture.az.gov/seasonal-passes>. There is no charge for Livestock Dept. entries.

Animals must be checked in on the fairgrounds **no later than 8:00 pm, Wednesday, September 25.** Open livestock will be judged prior to the 4H/FFA classes for each division. Animals will be released Sunday, September 29, at 5:00 pm. The Fair Association shall reserve the right to limit entries to facilities available and may limit the number of entries made by an exhibitor. Any limits under this rule will be done generally and without discrimination. The Superintendent shall have full charge of barns, stalls and pens including the assignment of the same.

Exhibitors are responsible to the Superintendent for the cleaning of their stalls and pens. These should be done twice daily or as frequently as necessary. The feeding and watering of livestock is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Exhibitors of individual animals must furnish their own feed boxes and watering buckets. Transportation, feed, bedding (shavings) and care of the animals is the responsibility of the exhibitor. The Fair Association and/or the Superintendent will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to any livestock exhibited.

No premium ribbon decorations previously won by an animal shall be exhibited prior to judging. All animals in livestock classes must be owned by the exhibitor. Each class may have entries in lots as listed below the class. When entering, indicate the class and lot numbers.

All does in milk must be milked dry between the hours of 6 and 7 p.m. the evening prior to judging. (No Billy Goats will be accepted.)

CLASS # 101 - ANY RECOGNIZED BREED

If enough animals of certain breeds are exhibited, additional classes may be added.

The following lots apply to all classes of dairy goats:

- 36 Baby kid (Apr 1, 2019 to Aug 31, 2019)
- 37 Senior kid (Oct 1, 2018 to Mar 31, 2019)
- 38 Yearling
- 39 Junior milkers (under 2 years in milk)
- 40 2 year milkers (2 years and under 3 in milk)
- 41 Mature milkers (3 years and under 5 in milk)
- 42 Aged doe (5 years and over in milk)

DIVISION F - MEAT GOATS

I, the undersigned Participant, hereby acknowledge that I desire to participate in Cochise County Fair and hereby assume all risk of participation. I hereby release Cochise County Fair Association (“CCFA”) from all liability relating to my County Fair Exhibit during the Cochise County Fair of 2019. I voluntarily agree to the terms of this Project as follows:

1. Release and Waiver. Participant does hereby release and forever discharge and hold harmless CCFA and its successors and assigns from any and all liability, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature, either in law or in equity that arise or may hereafter arise from Participant's Activities with CCFA.

PARTICIPANT UNDERSTANDS THAT THIS RELEASE DISCHARGES CCFA FROM ANY LIABILITY OR CLAIM THAT THE PARTICIPANT MAY HAVE AGAINST CCFA WITH RESPECT TO ANY BODILY INJURY, PERSONAL INJURY, ILLNESS, DEATH, OR PROPERTY DAMAGE THAT MAY RESULT FROM PARTICIPANT'S ACTIVITIES WITH CCFA, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF CCFA OR ITS OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES, OR AGENTS OR OTHERWISE. PARTICIPANT ALSO UNDERSTANDS THAT CCFA DOES NOT ASSUME ANY RESPONSIBILITY FOR OR OBLIGATION TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE OR OTHER ASSISTANCE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO MEDICAL, HEALTH, OR DISABILITY INSURANCE IN THE EVENT OF INJURY OR ILLNESS.

2. Medical Treatment. Participant does hereby release and forever discharge CCFA from any claim whatsoever which arises or may hereafter arise on account of any first aid, treatment, or service rendered in connection with the Participant's Activities with CCFA.

3. Assumption of the Risk. The Participant understands that the Activities may involve handling animals, and being exposed to animals both owned by the participant and by others. Activities will require interacting with said animals and facilities, equipment, and grounds owned and operated by CCFA. Participant hereby expressly and specifically assumes the risk of injury or harm in the Activities, and releases CCFA from all liability for injury, illness, death, or property damage resulting from the Activities.

4. Insurance. The Participant understands that, in the event of accident or injury, Participant is responsible for all costs associated with any medical treatment. Participant shall be responsible for all costs and may utilize any medical insurance or other insurance coverage of Participant. Participant is aware that CCFA is not liable for any costs and that CCFA is not liable or responsible to have insurance to cover any costs of Participant.
